



WHO'S WHO WILD GOOSE CHASE

This cast includes members from California, Colorado, England, New Zealand, Northeastern United States and some native Washingtonians, with educational backgrounds in Pennsylvania, Montana, Liverpool, England, and Christchurch, New Zealand, ages from 18 to 60, equal rights for men and women (five of each in the cast, originally) with employment in jobs ranging from baby-sitting, legal writing, computer programming, court reporting, to retired.

The directors, Norah Douglas and Dorothy Clark, both attended UPSone of them having recently graduated and the other remembering when the school was still a college. Norah makes stuffed animals (our goose is one of hers) and collects antiques. Dorothy is a free lance writer, poet, has been involved in theatre in all capacities for most of her life.

TRACY THOMPSON (PATRICIA) has extensive experience in acting for one so young. She appeared in TLT's "The Effect of Gamma Rays" last spring, the leading roles in "The Man Who Came to Dinner," "Blithe Spirit," "High Window" and "An Italian Straw Hat" at Wilson High School. She contributed to the spirit of ERA when she became the first girl drum major that Wilson ever had was president of their Thespian Society and took the thespian trip to London, England in March. Tracy participated in the Hand Bell choir, the voice choir and the band in high school.

ALEX LEWINGTON (ADA) was born and bred in Liverpool, England. A lively saggitarian, she has three passions in life: Acting, Antiques and Art... (sometimes also Mark L.?) ... and detests cigarette smoke and sport. The farthest Alex willingly walks is to the store and back! Since arriving in Tacoma last August, she has appeared as the threatened wife in "Dial M for Murder" and the snooty Gwendolen Fairfax in "The Importance of Being Earnest" at TLT. She is the Wardrobe Mistress and serves on the Board of Directors for TLT.

CHARLOTTE ASKEW (LADY ELROOD) comes from Denver, Colorado. She and her husband are retired and are traveling extensively. They stopped in Tacoma to visit a daughter, came to audition for this play and decided to stay for its run. Originally, Charlotte came from West Chester, Pa., where she studied acting at Carnegie Tech and the Little Hedgerow Theatre, has played a wide variety of roles from Shakespeare's Puck to the Housekeeper in "Haunting of Hill House." Charlotte graduated from John Hopkins School of Nursing and was an American Airlines stewardess. For relaxation, she reads Greek and Roman History, skiis and fishes.

LUCINDY DEVLIN thinks of herself as more of a lighting designer than an actress, but those of us in the theatre dismiss her modestv. She has experience on the stage, has done all the jobs in the Theatre at one time or another office manager, janitor, prop person. She approaches the role of WEDGWOOD with the same concern for excellence that she has shown in all her other projects. 8 years of her spare time (and some not so spare) have been devoted to volunteering at TLT. She also has assisted the Real World Players and Ballet Tacoma, TLT employed her as the interim business manager here for six months. Lucindy likes camping, sailing, and (according to her resum'e) she will be soon employed as a thief.

CHESTER DREADNOUGHT (alias Roger Newton-Strangeways) is played by MARK LEWINGTON. The most recent production in which he appeared was his marriage to Alex Murray. Other roles at TLT have been "Dial M for Murder" (in which he tried to murder Alex) and "The Importance of Being Earnest" (in which he fell in love with her). He won the Richard Odlin Memorial Award for that one. A New Zealander. Mark has appeared in shows there in the Christchurch Repertory, and at the Kramer Center, Illinois. Reading, rambling and gin are other interests that consume his time.
