## DIRECTOR'S NOTE:

"There is a misconception of tragedy; it is the idea that tragedy is of necessity allied to pessimism. This impression is so firmly fixed that I almost hesitate to claim that, in truth, tragedy implies more optimism than does comedy and that its final result ought to be the reinforcement of the on-looker's brightest opinions of the human being.

"Pathos truly is the mode of the pessimist. But tragedy requires a nicer balance between what is possible and what is impossible. It is curious that the plays we revere, century after century, are the tragedies. In them lies the belief—optimistic, in the perfectability of man.

"It is time we take up this bright thread of our history and follow it to the only place it can possibly lead in our time — the heart and spirit of the average man."

Among her many accomplishments was her role as director of Artburst last summer for the Tacoma-Pierce County Civic Arts Commission. She has a BA in music from Evergreen College in Olympia and has been composing since 1977. Terri's works have been performed at such places as the and/or gallery and the Arts Resource Center, both in Seattle.

About her involvement with this production, Terrie has this to say "When composing the score for 'Death of a Salesman,' I kept in mind the character of each individual and attempted to capture the depth of his or her personality. On the whole, the score is centered around personality rather than situation — although I deviate from that concept occasionally. Composing incidental music is especially challenging, as one attempts to manifest a mood, personality or situation in as few measures as possible."

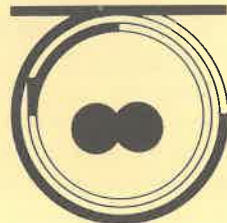

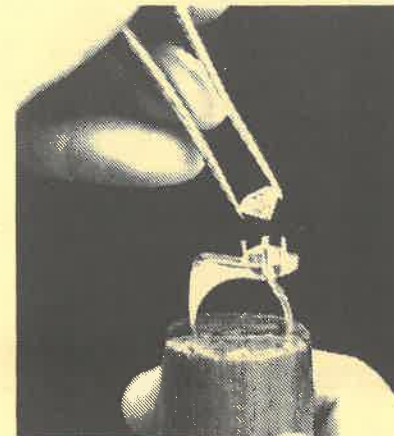

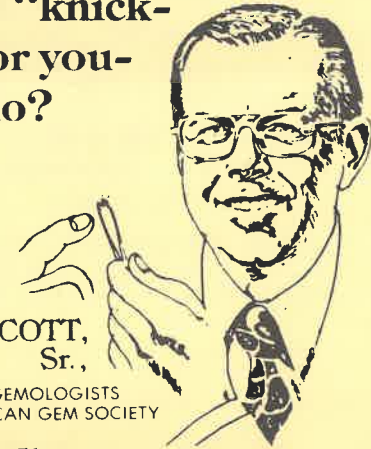
