



Of special interest to us locally is the fact that Gypsy's life and career began i Seattle. She was born and lived there off and on with her mother and siste June in their grandfather's house. Their vaudeville act was first performed i local lodge halls there, then progressed to Seattle's vaudeville houses befor moving on to other locales and better-paying, somewhat higher-qualit theatres.
