CAROLLO has been educated in Music and Dance at Bradford College in Massachusetts and received her BA from Scripps College in Claremont, CA. She has participated in summer stock, community theatre and dinner theatre, as well as studying acting, voice and dance privately in studios and workshops in the greater Los Angelos area... GEORGE MCGILLIARD, a real estate agent for Pen West, has a degree in theatre from Albion College and the University of Michigan. He is the Artistic Director for the Performance Circle and has received excellent reviews for his directorial abilities and memorable performances... still a newcomer to the theatre, DOUG WHITTLES has enjoyed his association with the Performance Circle having appeared in many of their productions, most recently "The Sound of Music."
