

SYNOPSIS OF SCENES


The time is the early 1920's.

WHO'S WHO IN THE CAST

JOYCE WILSON (Mrs. Cohen) was born in Lancashire, England. She came to the USA in Dec. 1952 and has lived in Germany, New York, Colorado Springs and Connecticut. She has been a resident of Tacoma for the past 14 years. Joyce studied drama in England and took classes at TCC. She has been active in church productions and is presently employed as a stenographer at McChord AFB, working for NORAD, Intelligence. BER-NARD SIMON (Mr. Cohen) is a newcomer to the stage and is thoroughly enjoying the experience. This is a "great change of pace" says Bernie, who is the owner of Simon's Tack n' Togs, a retail store for riders. MARKKU SARIO (the Rabbi) has been active in amateur theatre in Oregon and Washington for many years, having performed in over 20 productions as an actor, pianist or director. His most recent appearance's were major roles in 'Sleuth' and 'The Fourposter' for Real World Players. Mark is an attorney in Tacoma.
