



Prisoner of 2nd Avenue, Frankenstein and others at 565 Broadway, Tacoma Little Theatre, Lakewood Players, Tacoma Community College, etc. By profession a library reference specialist, she is also a bibliographer and a specialist in the field of Chinese-American history. Among her published works are Straw Hats, Sandals and Steel: the Chinese in Washington State and Sinophobia: the Expulsion of the Chinese.... Married since 1948. she and her husband, Jim, have 5 children and 6 grandchildren. When time permits she and her husband enjoy fishing in local waters.

MCKENHA MICHALS (Chelsea)

McKenha was last seen as Jennet Jourdemayne in The Lady's Not For Burning. She has performed in several area theatre productions: 2 for the Seesaw, Same Time Next Year, King Lear, As You Like It, Twelfth Night, A Midsummer Night's Dream. McKenha will be directing a romantic comedy by Bernard Slade at Lakewood Playhouse in the fall. Previously she directed Scrooge, a Musical, You're a Good Man, Charlie Brown, Miracle Worker, Twelfth Night and Stage Door. McKenha has had many years of dance training which has been put to use in planning the choreography for My Fair Lady, Kiss Me, Kate, Guys and Dolls, South Pacific, Brigadoon and Oklahoma!. Theatrical Resource Coalition is her employer. McKenha loves summer and race cars.

ROBERT SPEIGHT (The Mailman, Charlie) Bob first appeared on the Tacoma Little Theatre stage in 1958 as Sergeant King in No Time for Sergeants. He has been on stage, behind the scenes in production, and in front of the stage as a director since then. Locally he has also been seen at 565, Lakewood Playhouse, and Fort Steilacoom Community College Theatre. Bob has had roles in Lily, the Felon's Daughter and The Lady's Not For Burning this year. During his military career, his interest in the theatre led to stage appearances world wide, from Alaska to Iran. After retiring from the Air Force, Bob had a second career working at the Bremerton Shipyards. He has now retired a second time and is enjoying spending time with his daughters and new granddaughter.

PATRICK WATSON (Billy)

Pat started his public acting career in first grade when he played The Littlest Angel in the Christmas show at St. Patrick's School. Shortly after that he studied dance at the Jan Collum School until age ten. He performed many recital dances at the Temple Theatre and T.L.T. 


