

About The Cast

Duncan MacLean (Archie). It's a true statement to say "Duncan's second home is the theatre". He has been active on stage since 1953, and this will be his 146th production! In Duncan's last show at T.L.T. he played the role of "Judge Turpin" in SWEENEY TODD. At Lakewood Players "The Older Man" in VERONICA'S ROOM, performed many productions with the Cirque Dinner Theatre, appears annually with THE NUTCRACKER with Ballet Tacoma and this just "touches" upon his credits as an actor Duncan's expressive personality and talent have made him a recognized storyteller and he has traveled throughout the Northwest as a professional storyteller. We will continue to see Duncan on stage - as he puts it, "If I didn't enjoy it, I wouldn't do it".

Doug Saxby (Jake). Most of Doug's theatrical experience has been in the San Francisco area where he was the Associate Artistic Director of a regional repertory theatre for over 10 years. Tacoma Little Theatre audiences will remember him most recently as "Hobson" in HOBSON'S CHOICE. He also played the part of "The Producer" in dinner theatre with Ray Walston in YOU KNOW I CAN'T HEAR YOU WHEN THE WATER'S RUNNING. All totaled Doug has more than 25 years in professional and community theatre. In addition he has a Ph.D in philosophy and religion; is a gourmet cook and is the owner of Travel Network: University Place Tours.

Rochelle H. King (Margaret Morley). Rochelle H. King has been involved in all phases of theatre for close to (gasp!) 30 years. (Yes, it's true, she doesn't look it!) She has appeared in over 50 productions and has worked as a director, writer, stage manager and house manager. She is best known to Seattle audiences for her work at the Brass Ring Theatre, where she was a founding company member. Rochelle is not at all known to Tacoma audiences as this show marks her Tacoma debut! Her favorite roles, include "Maggie" in CAT ON A HOT TIN ROOF, "Gittel" in TWO FOR THE SEESAW, and "Rosemary" in PICNIC as well as croissants, bagels and cheese danish. Rochelle has taught improvisation in Seattle for the past five years and currently teaches creative dramatics to developmentally disabled young adults in Seattle and Bellevue.

John Flynn (Walter Morley). John comes to The Tacoma Little Theatre from Burien where he has performed at The Burien Little Theatre in SHADOW BOX and 6 RMS. RVR. VW. His theatre interests began in high school but were temporarily interrupted when instead of acting and producing plays he married and produced 5 children. His time then became involved with family matters and being a scoutmaster for both girl and boy scouts. He is employed with Acme Iron Works and finds time to spend his creative energy writing short stories, poetry and being involved with film making.

Rebekah Allison (Lily Agnes). Rebekah's been involved in community theatre for over 6 years and was last seen at T.L.T. as "Jackie" in HAY FEVER. She has appeared with Lakewood Players and recently received the award for best supporting actress in the Forscom production of A LITTLE NIGHT MUSIC. Rebekah has said in the T.L.T. program interview "I am as old or as young as you perceive me to be. I love theater, it is my dream, and in the next two hours join me in sharing this dream."

Bernard Simon (Gramps Fergusan). Bernard has spent many years as owner of Simon's Tack'N Togs, a retail store for horsemen. Because of his business demands, he lacked the discretionary time to do community theatre as he would have liked. According to Bernard, while listening to his car radio he heard an announcement asking for mature male actors at the Tacoma Little Theatre and by coincidence he noticed he was driving right past the theatre. Since he was then semi-retired he thought he would stop in and give it a try. This proved to be a good choice for us and the community as he has successfully acted at T.L.T. in ABIE'S IRISH ROSE and Lakewood Players THE ODD COUPLE and NO SEX PLEASE WE'RE BRITISH.

Robert Musser (Gibson McFarland). Robert Musser is Professor of Music. Director of Bands and Chairman of Wind and Percussion at the University of Puget Sound and is founder, director and conductor of the Tacoma Concert Band. In the years that Musser has been at UPS he has developed the UPS Wind Ensemble into one of the most outstanding bands in the Northwest. He maintains a very busy schedule throughout the Northwest as a quest conductor, adjudicator, clinician and soloist. At present Robert Musser is an active performer on oboe and saxophone. He is the 1st oboist with The Tacoma Symphony. A theatre enthusiast, he has given his talents as a musical director for numerous musicals produced by UPS and for T.A.G.'s 1st production, GUYS AND DOLLS. Recent Awards received by Musser are "The Order of the Phoenix," given by the Western International Band Clinic; and the "National Band Association Citation of Excellence," for his outstanding contribution to bands and band music.

Our Director

David Domkoski

This is Mr. Domkoski's second production for Tacoma Little Theatre, having directed the macabre SWEENEY TODD, THE DEMON BARBER OF FLEET STREET in 1983. Other directing credits include the Northwest premieres of Tom Kempinski's DUET FOR ONE, and Sheldon Rosen's NED AND JACK for The Performance Circle in Gig Harbor. Also for that theatre company, he directed Shakespeare's THE TAMING OF THE SHREW. A MID-SUMMER NIGHT'S DREAM, and TWELFTH NIGHT; G.B. Shaw's ARMS AND THE MAN; Woody Allen's PLAY IT AGAIN, SAM; the American premier of Michael Cook's JACOB'S WAKE; and Moliere's THE MISER. As an actor (a passion which he has since forsaken) he has appeared as "Dysart" in Peter Shaffer's EQUUS, "Orgon" in Moliere's TARTUFFE, "Captain Shotover" in Shaw's HEARTBREAK HOUSE, and as "Sir Oliver Surface" in Richard Brinsley Sheridan's A SCHOOL FOR SCANDAL. Mr. Domkoski loves cats; hates sophomoric comedies (though he admits to having directed one or two), fanatics of any ilk, and searching for a parking space in downtown Seattle. His one goal in life is to be invited to star in PORKY'S VII: THE DAY AFTER THE NEXT DAY.


