

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

About The Cast

Olivia DeCoursey Satterwhite (The Mute). Olivia came to Tacoma six years ago from Philadelphia where she was part of the Philadelphia Youth Theatre. Once in Tacoma, she performed in various plays for the Ndaba Cultural Ensemble. Among the productions were Simply Heavenly, The Amen Corner, God's Favorite, and For Colored Girls Who Have Considered Suicide When the Rainbow is Enul. When not on stage, Olivia is employed by the University of Puget Sound.

Robert Musser (Hucklebee). Robert appeared as 'Gibson McFarland' in Tacoma Little Theatre's season opening production of Artichoke. He is well known to Tacoma audiences as a performing musician. He is the conductor of the Tacoma Concert Band and the University of Puget Sound Wind Ensemble. Mr. Musser is also the First Oboist of the Tacoma Symphony Orchestra. A theatre enthusiast, he has given his talents as a musical director for numerous musical produced by UPS, as well as for TAG's first production of Guys and Dolls.

Tom Birkeland (Bellomy). It's been 10 years since Tom did a musical, and now he knows why he retired his dancing shoes. Tom has already lost 25 lbs. and that's in his feet alone.
