A BRIEF HISTORY THE TACOMA LITTLETHEATRE

In 1918 the Tacoma Little Theatre sprang from a devoted group called The Civic Drama League. This cultural organization wanted to promote the theatrical arts in the community and offered lectures, study groups and play readings. As they grew in numbers, the need for a theatre became imperative.

During the 1920's, the Annie Wright Seminary was located at Tacoma Avenue and Division Street. They had a small stage and auditorium they made available to the drama league for the production of plays.

As Tacoma grew, the seminary sold this property and relocated to North Tacoma Avenue, where Annie Wright is today. Of course, this left The Civic Drama League without a theatre. The old Slovonian Hall at the foot of the 30th Street hill was available and the group proceeded to build a stage and auditorium, all volunteer. They were so successful that soon The Civic Drama League outgrew this facility and began searching for a new home. It was during this time they added the name of Tacoma Little Theatre as their production company, eventually to drop the name of The Civic Drama League from public use.

In 1939 and 1940 theatre members held endless benefits, parties and sales in order to purchase our present building at 210 North 'I' Street. The building was an auto repair garage that became the stage and auditorium area. The lobby of today was added about 1950. This garage required extensive remodeling. Improvements consisted of a trussed roof, a revolving stage (building on a Northern Pacific Railroad track). dressing rooms, heating plant, lavatories, and special wiring for productions. Used seats were secured from the University of Washington.

As you can see, the Tacoma Little Theatre has a history of supporters who value theater in our community. We invite you to experience live theatre and to support your community theatre now, to preserve it for the future generations.

Alan Ayckbourn's "Absurd Person Singular" is a comedy set at Christmastime so it comes as no great surprise that its humor and merriment are rooted in chaos, pain and the tragedy of everyday life. Ayckbourn's comic world has always been dominated by truthful interaction between realistic people with the result that his plays, no matter how outrageous or farcical they may become, are based in the bitter fact of human fallibility. Christmas is supposed to be a time of incredible peace and joy – this is a fact we have stuffed down our throats yearly by the perpetually cheery glut of commercial advertising that seems to begin its relentless descent sometime around Halloween. But underneath the tinsel and the toys, it can also be cause, as many studies have proven, for overwhelming depression, family squabbles and friendly pettiness. It is also a prime time for suicide. The demented insistence on love and happiness supposedly shared by one and all, can make those who are lacking either only more intensely sorrowful. There are few occasions more tension-filled than enforced frivolity. "Absurd Person Singular," with its trio of disastrous holiday get-togethers and sense of Christmas-Card catharsis, provides us with a precious gift – the luxury of looking at ourselves and laughing till we cry, rather than doing the opposite.


