A graduate of Incarnate World college in San Antonio, Texas, she also attended the University of Puget Sound. Eileen lives at Fort Lewis, where her husband is career military. She performed in San Antonio ('Hedda Gabler,' and Crimes of the Heart').

Randy Clark (Doc) recently appeared at TLT as Megs in 'Strange Snow' and also appeared in 'The Glass Menagerie' and 'A Thousand Clowns.' He appeared at Chinook Theater ('Scrooge') and Lakewood Players ('Nightwatch'). A graduate of the University of Puget Sound, Randy recently returned from Los Angeles where he performed in various productions.

McKenna Michaels (Meg) is making her debut at TLT in this production, but has performed frequently in Tacoma, at Tacoma Actors Guild ('Amadeus') and the University of Puget Sound ('A View from the Bridge') where she was graduated. An equity candidate, she has acted and performed in the dance company at the Oregon Shakespeare Festival. Her most recent performance in Seattle was in 'My Brother's Keeper' at the Northwest Playwrights Festival, New City Theater.

Annalisa Bowers (Babe) is also making her acting debut at TLT. A graduate of Western Washington University, she has performed at Laughing Horse Theatre in Ellensburg ('Artichoke' and 'Table Manners'), but has been involved in theatre since grade school (title role in 'The Mouse Who Loved Meatloaf').

Alan Marshall Brown (Barnette Lloyd) is also a newcomer to TLT, recently returning from Denver where he was a director at the Eden Theater ('Soldier's Play,' 'Raisin in the Sun,' and 'Prometheus Bound'). A BRIEF HISTORY OF THE TACOMA LITTLE THEATRE

In 1918 the Tacoma Little Theatre sprang from a devoted group called The Civic Drama League. This cultural organization wanted to promote the theatrical arts in the community and offered lectures, study groups and play reading. As they grew in numbers, the need for a theatre became imperative. During the 1920's, the Annie Wright Seminary was located at Tacoma Avenue and Division Street. They had a small stage and auditorium they made available to the drama league for the production of plays.

As Tacoma grew, the seminary sold this property and relocated to North Tacoma Avenue, where Annie Wright is today. Of course, this left the Civic Drama League without a theatre. The old Slovonian Hall at the foot of the 30th Street his was available and the group proceeded to build a stage and auditorium, all volunteer. They were so successful that soon The Civic Drama League outgrew this facility and began searching for a new home. It was during this time they added the name of Tacoma Little Theatre as their production company, eventually to drop the name of The Civic Drama League from public use. In 1939 and 1940 theatre member held endless benefits, parties and sales in order to purchase our present building at 210 North 'I' Street. The building was an auto repair garage that became the stage and auditorium area. The lobby of today was added about 1950. This garage required extensive remodeling. Improvements consisted of a trussed roof, a revolving stage (building on a Northern Pacific Railroad track), dressing rooms, heating plant, lavatories and special wiring for productions. Used seats were secured from the University of Washington.

As you can see, the Tacoma Little Theatre has a history of supporters who value theatre in our community. We invite you to experience live theatre and to support your community theatre now, to preserve it for the future generations.
