

The events of *The Fox* take place on the old Bailey Farm in England during the month of November, 1918.

Director's Notes

D.H. Lawrence wrote about love...well, let me rephrase that...D.H. Lawrence was consumed by love, and his finest short novel, *The Fox*, is unequivocally a study of love — even if it does not answer to the ordinary notion of a love story.

The Fox is a study of human mating, of the attraction between a man and a woman that expresses the profound needs of each. It is a picture of the ruthlessness of nature (and life) and how the denial of vital forces can lead to the emergence of powers only nature truly understands.

Lawrence felt that the ideal state is the permanent marriage of two self contained people and this ideal is embodied in Henry and Nellie. The story, however, is also very much about the submission of will. It is this conflict that gives the story its life.

Finally, it is a story about the attainment of happiness. It is so human to pluck flower after flower, yet it is never *the* flower. Lawrence's stories don't end...that is to say the ending lies outside the confines of the story. His characteristic solution is to move on, start again seeking that which was unattained.

When I first approached *The Fox* I was somewhat worried about making early 20th Century English life accessible to 21st Century Americans. But the more I delved into Lawrence's mind and time, the more similarities between our eras were revealed. An upheaval in sexual roles (the words feminism and homosexual first came into use) verses the changes wrought by women's lib and the gay rights movement, an epidemic syphilis crisis verses AIDS... a backlash against moral liberalism that called for a return to traditional family values... urban hopelessness, imperial decline, censorship and the arts, even women's hairstyles reflect an almost mirror image of life across the century. The more things change, the more they stay the same.

Director's Bio

William R. Cole has been an actor on various stages since the age of six. William first turned his hand to directing eight years ago. At that time he was a member of the acting company of a showcase theatre group called Ashland Resident Theatre in Ashland, Oregon. He went on to become ART's producing and artistic director. Credits include such shows as Talking With, Cold Storage, Sexual Perversity, In Chicago, and Sister Mary Ignatious Explains it All for You. William currently resides in Seattle, working as an actor, director, playwright, and waiter. As you read this he is working on completing a companion piece to his last one-act play, Stumbling After Paradise, entitled Feasting on a Banquet of Crumbs. He also serves as New City Theatre's house manager. When not consumed with theatre, William's passions include film, fiction, television (someone who admits to it!) and his lady-love, Heidi!

Nancy Krebs comes to Tacoma Little Theatre from the Pacific Conservatory of the Performing Arts via Ashland, Oregon, where she earned a degree in Theatre from Southern Oregon State University. (1987), The Russian Hit Woman in Ionesco's Macbett at P.C.P.A., and Suzannah in Alan Ayckbourn's Bedroom Farce for Southern Oregon State. Nancy spent the last year settling into the Puget Sound area (where she spent her childhood), and waiting tables to support her eating habit.


Henry Grenfel, Bob Stalder


