Her "Particulate Matter" series grows from her observations of new cloud formations over Puget Sound. Carbon clouds and carbon rainbows inspire her to create a metaphor in paper tapestry. She transforms "found paper," newspapers, metal foils and plastic, assembling them on a loom.

Cast & Staff Biographies

Alan Marshall Brown (Deputy File) has previously appeared at TLT in Man of LaMancha, 1940s Radio Hour, and Lone Star. He directed The Amen Corner at TLT about 10 minutes ago.

Nyree Clark (*Lizzie Curry*) Nyree is thrilled to be making her TLT debut as Lizzie. Born and raised in Seattle, Nyree has a degree in education from PLU and also a BFA in Drama & English from the University of Washington. Love and thanks to Danny and Nicholas.

Randy Clark (Noah Curry) Randy's TIT appearances have included "Pantalone" in A Servant of Two Masters, "Murray" in A Thousand Clowns, "Frank" in Educating Rita, and "Megs" in Strange Snow.

Clark Maffitt (H.C. Curry) An actor and musician for over 30 years, Clark's other TLT appearances include: "The Wizard" in Once Upon a Mattress, "Atticus" in To Kill a Mocking-bird, "Charlemagne" in Pippin, and "Other Men" in Later Life. He has still never performed in Vermont.

Mikel Michener (Jim Curry) This is Mikel's first appearance on the TLT stage, as he has just recently graduated from PLU with a BFA in Theatre. At PLU Mikel has appeared as "Cyrano" in Cyrano de Bergerac, "Mitch" in A Streetcar Named Desire, and "Emperor Joseph II" in Amadeus.

John Munn (*Bill Starbuck*) feels very fortunate to have been involved in local theatres as an actor, director and producer. Recent roles include "Rick" in *Six Degrees of Separation* at TLT and "Dr. Einstein" in *Arsenic and Old Lace* at Renton Civic Theatre.

Mike Storslee (Sheriff Thomas) Mike's last appearance at TLT was as "King Sextimus The Silent" in Once Upon A Mattress.

Rod Pilloud (Director) Rod has been a professional director, actor and production manager for theatres around the nation over the past 30 years. He has worked with such companies as The Seattle Repertory Theatre, Los Angeles Shakespeare Festival, The Milwaukee Repertory Theater, The Empty Space Theatre, The Portland Repertory Theatre and A Contemporary Theatre. His numerous directing credits include: Picnic, Of Mice and Men, Twelfth Night, Angel Street, and Shadow Box. For TLT, Rod has directed I'm Not Rappaport and Noises Off, both winners of the Richard Odlin Award for outstanding production of a play. He also directed last year's Later Life here. Rod is currently an Associate Artistic Director at The Empty Space Theatre in Seattle.

Rebecca Rex (*Stage Manager*) For the past five seasons 'Becca has participated in TLT in a wide variety of volunteer activities. She is most often found stage managing one of TLT's Mainstage productions.

J.D. Cullen (Costumes) Judy's design work is familiar to most long-time patrons of TLT as she has designed over a dozen productions (usually scenery) since joining the TLT staff in 1993. As a professional scenic designer, she has worked for numerous theatres including The Bathhouse Theatre in Seattle, Portland's Musical Theatre Company, The Emmy Gifford Children's Theatre, Tacoma Actors Guild, and local PBS affiliate KBTC. Born and raised in Tacoma's North End, Judy feels exceptionally blessed to be plying her craft in her hometown.

Stephen D. Kramer (*Lighting Designer*) A transplant from Wisconsin, Stephen was dubbed "The Prince of Darkness" for owning that disembodied voice from the top of the ladder in the darkened theatre. Steve designed both *I'm Not Rappaport* and *Later Life* for Rod here at TLT. Recent productions also include this season's *Christmas Revels* show at the Rialto and Tacoma Musical Playhouse's production of *Grease*. Stephen is often heard quoting the late Gilbert Hemsley, yelling such phrases as "Lighting sells tickets!" and scaring his co-workers.

John Petterson (Set Designer) John is pleased to be designing his third production for TLT, having also designed A Little Night Music and last season's Once Upon a Mattress. His set design for other groups include productions of Pippin, Pump Boys and Dinettes and Company.

Director's Notes

A family, a good family, has a unique chemistry: a glue that binds and holds it together through the worst and best of times. The Currys of tonight's play are lucky enough to be in just this sort of family. Even in the worst of times, the special caliber of the relationships of these children and their father transcends any disagreement or arguement; somewhere deep inside each member of the family is the knowledge that whatever is said or done, no matter how painful or maddening, it is meant to help more than it hurts. At its best, each family member is full of love for the other and ready at an instant to protect and nurture each other. Add to this mix the cleverness, skill and special fervor of a Starbuck and you have a full-bodied stew of human passions. I sincerely hope you enjoy this evening's short stay with this wonderful group of people.
