Tacoma Little Theatre and Freehold Theatre co-sponsor the Vladivostok Chamber Drama Theatre's production of The Lower Depths, by Maxim Gorki. Directed by Leonid Anisimov.

Originally directed by Stanislavsky at the Moscow Art Theatre in 1902, The Lower Depths descends into the murky world of a crowded boarding house. The residents—including a drunken ex-actor, a fallen nobleman turned pimp, and a wild young thief—struggle towards love, hope and deliverance. Performed entirely in Russian, with live English translation and plot synopsis provided.

The Lower Depths plays for two days only at Tacoma Little Theatre: Friday, November 27th, 4:30-9:30pm, & Saturday, November 28th, 2:00-7:00pm.

Seating is strictly limited to 50 seats per performance, as the audience will be onstage with the performers. Admission is by suggested donation of \$10, and tickets are available at the TLT box office.
