### From the Artistic Director's Desk: About Charley's Aunt



Brandon Thomas was born in Liverpool on Christmas Eve 1856 (or 1850, no one seems toagree). He began his career as a comic actor in 1879 and extended his creative urges to include the writing of songs and plays. Brandon Thomas wrote over a dozen comedies, most of which received lukewarm receptions. Though Thomas might have preferred his career to have been compared with the genius of his contemporary, Oscar Wilde, his career might be likened more to that of a later American counterpart, Joseph Kesselring (1902-1967) who also wrote prolifically but who is generally remembered exclu-

sively for the classic comedy, Arsenic and Old Lace.

Mr. Thomas succeeded in his one moment of comic gold at the Theatre Royal of London in 1892 with the opening of *Charley's Aunt*. The show's farcical humor was wildly appreciated and ran for over four years, for a total of 1,466 performances. It was translated into many languages and, until the early 1930s, not a week went by without a performance somewhere in the world. At one point, 44 different productions of one of the most popular English farces of all time were running at the same moment across the globe. A young man in love masquerading as an old woman in a dress: that is high comedy in any language.

This popular British farce has been adapted for the screen nearly a dozen times beginning as a silent movie in 1915. In 1941 (four versions later) 20<sup>th</sup> Century Fox produced the version known in Britain as

Charley's American Aunt, in which Jack Benny played Lord Fancourt Babberly. The play was also re-fashioned into the musical Where's Charley? by George Abbott. The musical version is said to have helped to further the careers of aspiring actors Rex Harrison and Noel Coward. Over the years acting luminaries such as Jose Ferrer, Louis Nye, Roddy MacDowall and Raul Julia have all donned the black dress, gray wig, and fichu traditionally associated with this production.

It is generally thought that Thomas wrote the play on a lark to further the career of fellow actor and comedian, W.S. Penley (as well as his own). Thomas died in London in June of 1914.

JUDY CULLEN – Scenic Designer: Yes, she's STILL here! Thanks to Alex, Tracy, Mom, Sis & Brandon!


