From the Artistic Director's Desk: About The Secret Garden



I still remember the first time I encountered a story by Frances Hodgson Burnett and thinking that it was something unique and satisfying. Years later I designed a production of *The Little Princess* and again encountered Burnett's unique blend of Victorianism, spiritualism and optimism.

Like so many of her sister's of that time (1849-1924), Burnett redefined the perceived role of women in society, sometimes through contradiction. Burnett was the primary wage earner for her family in an era where a woman's place was still "in the home." She was married and divorced twice at a time when such was frowned upon. The bulk of her writing was in romance novels, but the writing she is best remembered for are the children's books which are laced with very adult themes of loss and redemption. No shrinking violet she, in 1888 Burnett won a lawsuit in England over the dramatic rights to *Little Lord Fauntleroy*, establishing a precedent that was incorporated into British copyright law in 1911.

For years I considered producing this play, but was always frustrated by the darkness of adaptations I read, including the musical. Finally, I was pleased to see Paula Wing's adaptation with its pacing and economic story line. This story is a triumph of the spirit not only for Mary Lennox, but how her choices affect those around her. Tragedy and loss are a part of life, and how we decide to move forward from it defines us. Do we live in the past? Or do we show respect for and celebrate the lives of those we love by embracing the world we live in. It is a choice we still struggle with. How will we live our lives and the face of the inevitable realities of loss? With anguish and regret? With celebration and renewal?




