
#### **Director's Notes**

### About the Cast

Joseph Allegro (*Michael/Fiddlesticks*) is making his TLT debut. **Kerry Bringman (Santa Claus)** This is his fourth show for TLT. Other productions here include *Wait Until Dark*, *Auntie Mame*, and *Much Ado About Nothing*. Originally from Florida, he currently lives in Puyallup. He works as a civil servant and as an adjunct professor for Southern Illinois University.

Christopher Cline (Louis Flapdoodle) Chris has been a stage and film actor and backstage technician for the past ten years in the Puget Sound area. He was last seen here in *Much Ado About Nothing*. Currenty he attends Tacoma Community College and works as an overnight freight stocker for Target. He works with the improve group, *The Tokens*.

She has received a number of honors from the 5th Avenue Theatre in Seattle for her work in the High School Musical Theatre Festival. Her last experience at TLT was with the children's summer drama program twenty years ago.

Kelly Herremans (Stage Manager) has recently moved to Tacoma from New York City. Dear Santa marks her return to the Theater world after being away for almost seven years. She works for TLT as a Box Office Assistant. She has a B.A. in Theatre from Hope College, Michigan. Kelly's past credits include being a personal dresser Off-Broadway in NYC, member of the Bear Creek Players Improv Toupe in Michigan, and the leading role in two different short films, Pious, and Broken Oblivion, which debuted at the Wilmington Film Festival in Wilmington, North Carolina.

**Ryan Coleman (Scene Design)** previously served as the Technical Director for six years at TLT. Currently the Production Manager for the newly formed Theatre Northwest. Works as a project manager for Puget Sound Builders. His last show here was designing lights for Blythe Spirit.

Matt Osier (*Light Design*) began his "career" at Tacoma Little Theatre through the youth program several years ago. He has performed every back stage duty at one time or another. After a busy summer when he was Technical Director for *Sussical*, *Jr.*, he is working on his fourth show this season. He has been the master carpenter for *Much Ado About Nothing* and *Leading Ladies*, set decorator for *Give 'em Hell, Harry*.

It seems trite to say that most non-profit organizations depend greatly on volunteerism. Tacoma Little Theatre is certainly no exception and relies heavily on volunteers. Currently, TLT has only three part time and two full time employees—those being the Artistic Director as well as the Education Director.

Actors and the stage crews are not paid; however, a small stipend is paid to the artistic staff (the director, and design teams) of each production. So the vast majority of the people associated with each show that you see at Tacoma Little Theatre are comprised of volunteers.

At TLT volunteers perform many tasks which range from an all-volunteer Board of Directors to the actors, to the ushers, to the set builders, to the cleaning crews. Without these dedicated people, producing plays at Tacoma Little Theatre simply would not happen.

In my short tenure here as the Interim Artistic Director, I have been impressed and thankful for those unselfish, theatre-loving individuals who keep this place afloat. I can tell you that these people are hard working, passionate, and committed supporters of this ninety-year-old icon. They have given countless hours of service to our community theatre.

TLT is fortunate to have several individuals on its Board of Directors who have weathered tough times and continue to serve. They deserve the thanks of all of us for their persistence and diligence.

And then there are those unsung heroes (in my mind) who have built the sets, hung the lights, painted the scenery, and vacuumed the backstage time and again. Three people deserve special mention. Matt Osier, Mike Valentine and Cindy Taylor. Matt began his tenure at TLT when he was a kid in the education program several years ago. Today he has become the master carpenter for most shows. He has an inspiring work ethic and attitude, which makes him a pleasure to have here. Mike Valentine is one of those people who always says, "Call me if you need help." And then he shows up. Mike is a skilled and reliable carpenter, too. His friendly nature makes building sets and any backstage work a lot more fun and enjoyable. He also makes sure that the premises are kept clean and that we get our trash to the dump when needed. Cindy Taylor is a busy woman as well as a masterful scene painter. For years, she had been working at TLT in that capacity and then took a hiatus while working on sets for the Tacoma Opera, Tacoma Musical Playhouse, and The Revels. This fall she came back to TLT and we are all the better for her return. Her talent, her pleasant demeanor and her work ethic make me feel good about calling upon her to give us a hand. Like Matt and Mike, she is one of those people on whom I can rely knowing that the job will be done right.

The set you see for *Dear Santa* was built and painted in six days by these three dedicated volunteers. They also did similar work for the recently closed hit *Leading Ladies*. Without their dedication and commitment to Tacoma Little Theatre, you would not be getting the quality sets and lights that you see tonight.

Any theatre must survive with dedicated volunteers like Matt, Mike and Cindy. Working backstage in the shadows of anonymity always demands the most time out of our unseen volunteers. There are several other people like, Kim, Brett, Alex and Erin who also have helped to make the production values as high as they are this season. They, like Matt, Mike and Cindy, all deserve a loud round of applause. They, the other volunteers, the actors, the production staffs, the Office staff, and the Board of Directors have made this a pleasant journey for me so far this season.
