

Director's Notes

For me, my grandparents are photographs. I never knew any of them. Two died before I was born, one died when I was four years old and the last one passed on when I was twenty three, but she lived far away, and I only saw her seven or eight times in my life.

My photographs of these people are mostly posed, unsmiling, and fading sepia images frozen in a charming time warp. Moreover, these images are laced with gaps that can never be filled. They

give me a few facts, but little else.

I will never experience those things that would make for indelible memories of my grandparents. I will never know their smiles, their smells, the texture of their hands, the warmth of their hugs, nor

the sounds of their laughter.

I will never know their special talents, their flashpoints, their views on survival, their views of life and the unknown, or their versions of their own stories,. Nor will I ever know what turned them on or what turned them off. These gaps in my knowing them have deprived me of the myriad of idiosyncrasies that made up each of their unique personalities.

Now as a grandparent and the patriarch and principle genealogist for my family, I find *Over the River and Through the Woods* especially meaningful and thought provoking. It gives me insights into what might have been. One of the reasons I like this play is that it reminds us that on the road to self-discovery, there is much more

to it than simply following one's dreams.

Staging plays can be a rewarding experience because doing so requires the collaboration of designers, producers, technical crews, and actors all pulling together to make our long hours and hard work appear effortless. For this show, the design team, the TLT staff, and several great volunteers have been top notch.



Larry Bommarito (Frank Gianelli) is a tool & die maker for North West Territorial Mint in Auburn. You may remember him as Long John Silver in TLT's production of *Treasure Island* in 2004. Those of you who are longtime TLT patrons may even remember him as Colonel Douglas in *A Case of Libel* back about 1971, the year before his first collaboration with our present director, Doug Kerr. Randy Clark (Nunzio Cristano) has acted and directed around the Puget Sound area for over thirty years. His other TLT credits include Tom in The Glass Managerie, both Albert and Murray in two different productions of A Thousand Clowns, Frank in Educating Rita, Noah in The Rainmaker and Juror #3 in 12 Angry Men. Other local credits include Scrooge in the musical Scrooge, Editor Webb in Our Town, Martini in One Flew Over The Cucoo's Nest and Ross in MacBeth. Dana Galagan (Aida Gianelli) previously appeared onstage at Tacoma Little Theatre in last season's Leading Ladies as Aunt Florence, and most recently in Lend Me a Tenor as Julia. Syra Beth Puett (Emma Cristano) Syra Beth's first performance in the Tacoma area was here at TLT thirty years ago. She was seen most recently here as Ethel Thayer in On Golden Pond. A native of Alabama, She was educated in Texas, holds a B.A. of Music Education degree, and retired from teaching music in Tacoma four years ago. At TLT, she has been in a dozen shows, including leads in Kiss Me Kate, Arsenic And Old Lace (best actress award), Noises Off and The Glass Menagerie. Elsewhere, she has had leading roles in The Hollow, The Gingerbread Lady, Death Of a Salesman, The Diary Of Anne Frank, Oklahoma, Carousel, and The Grapes Of Wrath.



Chad Rusell (Nick Cristano) This is Chad's first show at Tacoma Little Theatre in over 15 years since he got his start onstage playing Atticus's son, Jem in To Kill a Mockingbird. He is overjoyed to be back and it still feels like home. A student of theatre at the University of Portland, Cornish College of the Arts, and most recently the Adult Acting Class at TLT. This winter he has moonlighted as an actor, director, stage manager and musical percussionist in over fifty theatrical productions throughout the greater Puget Sound. His most recent work has been as Larry in Closer for Prodigal Sun Productions, George in Our Town at Lakewood Playhouse, and stage-managing and drumming this Summer for Capitol Playhouse's Kids at Play Season. In his spare time he enjoys sailing, playing music, and spending time with family and friends, especially Stacia & Nick whom he dedicates this performance.



Stacia Weber (Caitlain O'Hare) is very excited about her first performance at TLT. Though she has not acted before she has explored the arts through open mic poetry events, the winter Adult Acting Class at TLT, drawing, and digital photography/art. About the Artistic Staff

Doug Kerr (Director and Scene Designer) has worked on over 200 shows as an actor, director, designer, or producer in his 50 plus years in the theatre. He served as the Technical Director for The Summer Palace, was an actor and Company Manager for the touring Shakespearean troupe, The Commedians. He received his graduate degrees from Central Washington University and from Washington State University. He founded the theatre department (and served as its chair) at Pierce College where he taught for thirty years before retiring in 2001. He also was the Artistic Director of America Northwest Repertory Theatre which took six shows to Korea, Poland, and Mexico. Additionally, he has toured shows to remote Eskimo villages in Alaska in the middle of winter. While teaching he took two sabbatical leaves to England where, on one, he studied acting pedagogy at the Royal Academy of Dramatic Arts and The London Academy of Music and Dramatic Arts. On the other, he studied Shakespeare's staging techniques. He has served on national educational theatre committees, presented papers at several national and regional conferences, and served as an adjudicator for the Kennedy Center/American College Theatre Festival (KC/ACTF) for many years. He has been the recipient of nine prestigious Meritorious Achievement Awards for his directing and scene designs from the KC/ACTF. He was also recognized by the Washington Humanities Association and received their Exemplary Status Award and was selected by the Pierce College Faculty to deliver the annual Distinguished Faculty Address. He also has received the Northwest Drama Conference Teaching Recognition Award and a NISOD Award for Excellence in Teaching from the University of Texas. Last year he served as the Interim Artistic Director at Tacoma Little Theatre. His recent directing and/or designs at TLT, include Treasure Island, Leading Ladies, The Crucible and Lend Me a Tenor. At the Lakewood Playhouse some of his recent designs and/or directing projects have been: The Sound of Music, The Miracle Worker, Our Town, How the Other Half Loves. His direction and design work have also been seen at Washington State University, Centerstage, Centralia College. Eastern Oregon University, Tacoma Community College as well as other venues. He has also authored three plays.

Kelly Herremans (Stage Manager/Production Manager) has worked at TLT for the last year as the Box Office Manager. She was also the Stage Manager for *Dear Santa* and Production Manager for *A Christmas Story* here at TLT. Kelly also directed *Big Bad* a week long summer camp for children ages 5-14. She has a B.A. in Theatre from Hope College, Michigan. Kelly's past credits include being a personal dresser Off-Broadway in NYC, member of the Bear Creek Players Improv Toupe in Michigan, and the leading role in two different short films, Pious, and Broken Oblivion, which debuted at the Wilmington Film Festival in Wilmington, North Carolina.

Villa Kerr (Costume Designer) has been designing costumes for over twenty-five years. She was resident Costume Designer for the *America Northwest Repertory Theatre* where she designed over 150 costumes that toured to Europe, Asia and Mexico. Some of her favorite designs include: *E.R/Emergency Room, Tracers, One Flew Over the Cuckoo's Nest, Our Town, Death of a Salesman, All My Sons, Tartuffe, Desire Under the Elms, The Crucible, The Grapes of Wrath, The Heidi Chronicles, Lend Me a Tenor, Fences, An Enemy of the People, Vanity Plates, and The Miracle Worker. Her work has been seen at Pierce College, The Lakewood Playhouse, Tacoma Little Theatre, Centerstage, Eastern Oregon University, Centralia College as well as other venues. She has studied at the University of Kentucky at Madisonville, and received several awards for her artwork at Tacoma Community College and Pierce College. She also works as a Merchant Services Officer for Columbia Bank.*

Janna Webber (Light Designer) has just completed her B.A. in theatre from Loyola University Chicago this past December. She is excited to be making her post graduate design debut at Tacoma Little Theatre. Last summer she was the Assistant Light Designer for *The Buddy Holly Story.* Most recently she designed *Steel Magnolias* at Loyola and is looking forward to an upcoming Production Internship at Silk Road Theatre Project in Chicago. Thank you to everyone who put their hard work into this show.

Scott Campbell (Sound Designer) Scott is the Managing Artistic Director at Tacoma Little Theatre. He has created dozens of sound designs including *Holes, The Woman in Black, Seussical,* and many others. In addition to sound designing, Scott is a noted area director as well as an accomplished scenic and lighting designer. Scott is the winner of two Emmy awards and numerous other television awards. Last year, his production of *Macbeth* was named "Best Drama of the Year" by The News Tribune. Scott is recently starred in *A Tuna Christmas*. He thanks Julie, Sydney, and Paige for their tremendous love and support.




