

But tonight at TLT, you get to see a special performance where Charles Dickens leads his family and friends through a theatrical night of story telling and writing. Dickens encourages his actors to use the props and costumes of Dickens' theatricals to tell this story. Likewise Dr. Jekyll is not the pure soul we've come to believe him to be. While Hatcher's play honors the original, it gives a more complex interpretation of the duel nature of personalities and the evil that lurks in the hearts of men. 
