

Director's Notes

Sure, A.R. Gurney's *Sylvia* is about a dog. And about a couple of New York City dwellers and the people they meet. But at its core, *Sylvia* is about love: the love between two people who've raised a family and struggle to reshape their new empty-nest lives. The love between any human (man or woman) and a dog. The love we've all felt, hopefully, with a pet of any kind who loves us unconditionally (yes, even goldfish -- as you'll find out in Act I).

Sylvia has been running off-leash through theatre yards all across the country since 1996. I was delighted when TLT decided to open its 94th season with it -- and asked me to direct! I was even more delighted when these four wonderful actors and our production team agreed to work with me on bringing *Sylvia* to life.

Gurney did not have an easy time getting this story to the stage in the 1990s. He says, "It took me several years to get this play on stage because most of the theatres we offered it to felt it was insulting to women to be asked to play a dog. Ultimately Lynne Meadow at the Manhattan Theatre Club, who admitted she wasn't nuts about dogs, had no problem with asking Sarah Jessica Parker to take a crack at it... We were off and running."

Its core, as Gurney admits, is about an aging married man falling in love with an enticing girl but having the third part of the love triangle be a dog -- and a dog who lets us hear what she's thinking and feeling -- well, that makes for a love triangle on so many levels.

Live theatre is often about helping you peek through the windows into the lives of regular people who do regular things and face regular problems. At some point during this play, I hope you'll have an "aha!" moment. Maybe about your dog. Or maybe about your partner. Or, dare I say, maybe even about yourself. Then go back to enjoying some side-splitting laughter, because when all is barked and saliva-ed, we want to entertain you.

I know you'll find it funny. I hope you'll find it warm and touching as well. After all, you are getting the story of doggie love as straight poop from the pooch.

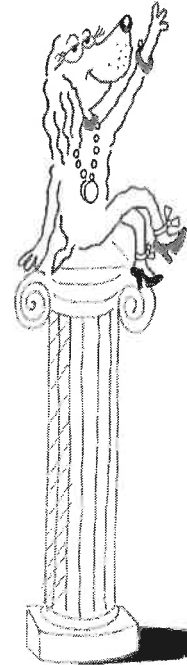

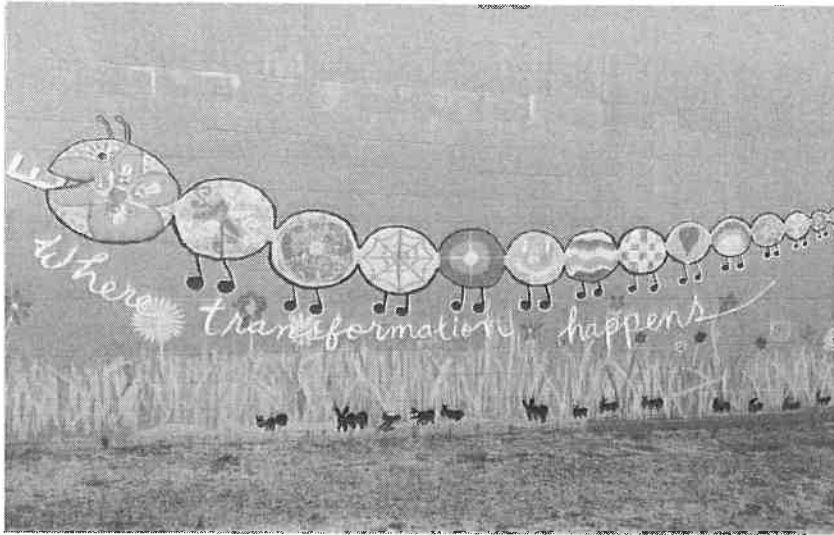

Have you seen our new mural?



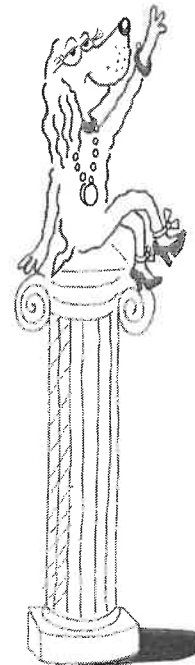
Steve Dunkelberger of Tacoma Weekly wrote:
